StoneX Trading Privacy Policy

StoneX Financial Pty Ltd (ABN 50 141 774 727, FSP No. 1001193) trading as StoneX Trading, and its related entities including StoneX Financial Ltd (UK Reg 05616586) and any other related entities from time to time ('**StoneX Trading**', '**we**', '**us**' or '**our**') recognise the importance of your privacy and are committed to handling personal information in accordance with the New Zealand Privacy Act 2020, including the Information Privacy Principles, as applicable to our New Zealand products and services.

This document sets out our policy for the collection, use, disclosure and management of your personal information. Personal information means information about an identifiable individual.

By choosing to provide your personal information to us and receiving products and services from us, you consent to our collecting, holding, using and disclosing your personal information in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

The kinds of personal information that StoneX Trading collects and holds

In order to conduct business with you and provide you with our products and services, StoneX Trading is required by New Zealand law and other applicable legal and regulatory requirements to collect personal information to identify you, assess whether our products and services are appropriate for you, and meet our customer due diligence and record-keeping obligations. The kinds of personal information that we may collect and hold about you may include your name, address, date of birth, contact details, occupation, income, assets and liabilities, bank account details, financial statements, credit reporting information, tax information and employment details.

How StoneX Trading collects personal information

We may collect your personal information directly from you when you give it to us in your application form, open and maintain an account with us, when you use our products and services, call us or visit our website to inquire about a product or service offered by us or so that we may conduct business with you. We may also need to do so to meet legal requirements.

We may also collect your personal information from third parties, including credit reporting bodies and any other relevant third parties.

StoneX Trading maintains records of your personal information and all transactions and activities on accounts that you have with StoneX Trading, including details of contracts traded and margin calls made.

Please note that because of the nature of the products and services we provide, and because we are required or authorised by or under New Zealand law and other applicable laws to deal with individuals who have identified themselves, we are unable to allow you the option of dealing with us on an anonymous basis.

Why is personal information required?

The purposes for which StoneX Trading collects, holds, uses and discloses your personal information are:

- **Legal** — we are required to confirm your identity and other personal information under applicable anti-money laundering and countering financing of terrorism laws, financial services laws and other legal or regulatory requirements. We may also disclose your personal information to credit reporting bodies, identity verification providers, sanctions screening providers or other service providers to confirm your identity, assess your application, meet legal obligations or manage risk.
- **Conducting business** —The personal information we hold may be used for establishing and managing your account, reviewing your ongoing needs, enhancing customer service and products and providing ongoing information or opportunities that we believe may be relevant to you. As a result, we may send you marketing material from time to time by email, telephone, SMS or other electronic messaging services.

If you do not provide us with all the information we consider to be necessary, we may be unable to provide, or be limited in the provision of, services or products that we offer.

If you do not wish to receive any marketing material from us, please let us know by emailing our customer service team at support.nz@stonex.com.

Importantly, except as set out in this Privacy Policy, we will not use or disclose your personal information unless permitted, authorised or required to do so by or under New Zealand law or another applicable law.

How StoneX Trading holds personal information

StoneX Trading takes reasonable steps to protect your personal information from misuse, interference and loss, and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure. Such reasonable steps include having measures in place to ensure that your personal information can only be accessed by our personnel who are properly authorised and are required to have access in the performance of their employment duties. We may store your personal information in hardcopy documents or electronically.

We may need to retain your personal information for a significant period of time. However, if we consider that your personal information is no longer needed for any of the purposes described above, and we are not required by or under New Zealand law or another applicable law to retain the information, we will take reasonable steps to securely destroy your personal information or ensure that the information is de-identified.

StoneX Trading may disclose personal information to overseas recipients and other entities

StoneX Trading may disclose your personal information to its related entities either in New Zealand, Australia or abroad, including the United Kingdom, Asia, the Middle East and elsewhere in the world from time to time. Where we disclose personal information outside New Zealand, we will take reasonable steps to ensure that the overseas recipient is required to protect the information in a way that, overall, provides comparable safeguards to those in the New Zealand Privacy Act 2020, unless an exception applies or you have authorised the disclosure after being expressly informed that comparable safeguards may not apply.

Other entities to whom StoneX Trading may disclose your personal information include:

- financial institutions and other similar organisations that StoneX Trading deals with in the course of its business activities, or those that are nominated by you;
- external service providers and professional advisers (which may be located overseas) that provide services to us;
- any organisation at your request or any persons acting on your behalf, including your financial adviser, broker, solicitor or accountant;
- introducing brokers with whom we have a mutual relationship (any of whom may be within or outside the European Economic Area) and who have introduced you to us;
- government, enforcement or regulatory bodies;
- credit reporting bodies or reference agencies;
- any other entities where you have otherwise consented; and
- any other entities if it is otherwise permitted, authorised or required by or under New Zealand law or another applicable law, including the Privacy Act 2020.

StoneX Trading Websites

When submitting an application form (whether online or via a mobile application or otherwise) or other documents, or when visiting our website or dealing in our products, StoneX Trading will collect and retain this information.

We also collect statistical information about visitors to our websites such as the number of visitors, pages viewed, types of processes executed, time online and documents downloaded. This information is used to evaluate and improve the performance of our websites. Unless you have provided your personal information to us, we do not collect any personal information through our websites other than statistical information.

You should also be aware that we use cookies on our websites. A cookie is a small amount of data, which often includes a unique identification number or value that is sent to your browser from a website's computer and stored on your computer's hard drive.

Each website can send its own cookies to your browser if your browser allows it. However, to protect privacy generally, your browser may only allow a website to access the cookies it has sent to your computer.

Cookies are used on our websites to collect the aforementioned statistical information so that you can access your accounts online. When accessing accounts online, a cookie will be created which uniquely identifies the computer, username and password. This eliminates the need to re-enter the aforementioned data each time accounts are accessed online.

Most internet browsers are set up to accept cookies. If you do not wish to receive cookies, you may be able to change the browser settings to refuse all cookies or have your computer notify you each time a cookie is sent, thereby giving the choice whether to accept it or not. If you reject all cookies, you will be unable to access accounts online. You can also delete cookies from computers after they have been created.

Telephone conversations

StoneX Trading may record telephone conversations and 'live' chats. We will advise you at the time of the telephone conversation that the call may be recorded and, if you do not wish to have it recorded, you can let us know. Such recordings or transcripts from such recordings may be used to resolve any dispute that you may have with us.

Recordings or transcripts made by StoneX Trading may be destroyed under StoneX Trading's normal practice.

Access to your information and corrections

We will respond to your request as soon as reasonably practicable and within the time required by the Privacy Act 2020. There is normally no fee for requesting access to or correction of your personal information, although depending on the nature or complexity of your request, we may charge a reasonable fee where permitted by law and will inform you of any applicable fee before processing the request.

Resolving your privacy complaints

If you wish to make a privacy complaint, including a complaint about how we have collected, used, disclosed, stored or managed your personal information, or about a possible breach of the New Zealand Privacy Act 2020, the Information Privacy Principles or this Privacy Policy, please contact the Compliance Department or StoneX Trading by telephone or email. Please include sufficient details of your concern and any relevant supporting information so that we can assess and respond to your complaint.

We will acknowledge and investigate your complaint as soon as reasonably practicable and aim to notify you of our findings within 30 days. If we need more time because of the nature or complexity of the complaint, we will let you know. If you are not satisfied with our response, or if you consider that your complaint has not been resolved, you may contact the New Zealand Office of the Privacy Commissioner.

Notifiable privacy breaches

The notifiable privacy breach regime under the New Zealand Privacy Act 2020 applies to agencies that hold personal information. A privacy breach may include unauthorised or accidental access to, disclosure, alteration, loss or destruction of personal information, or an action that prevents us from accessing personal information on a temporary or permanent basis.

If we become aware of a privacy breach that has caused, or is likely to cause, serious harm to an affected individual, we will notify the New Zealand Privacy Commissioner and affected individuals as soon as practicable, unless an exception applies. We will also take reasonable steps to contain, assess and remediate the breach.

In assessing whether a privacy breach is likely to cause serious harm, we will consider relevant factors including the sensitivity of the personal information involved, whether the information is protected by security measures, who has obtained or may obtain the information, the nature of the harm that may result and any steps taken to reduce the risk of harm.

We maintain internal procedures for identifying, escalating and responding to suspected privacy breaches, including notification where required by the Privacy Act 2020.
